Philip Jennings AM is the Emeritus Professor of Physics and Energy Studies at Murdoch University. He completed a Bachelor of Science with honours in Physical Chemistry at the University of Western Australia in 1962 and a PhD in Chemical Physics from Harvard University in 1967.

He was a Foundation member of the academic staff in physics when Murdoch University opened in 1975. Prior to that he held post doctoral positions at Bell Laboratories in the USA and Flinders University in SA and was a lecturer in Physics at the University of NSW from 1971 to 1974.

Philip retired in April 2012 but he remains active in research and community service at Murdoch University.

Philip Jennings is an expert in photovoltaics, particularly amorphous silicon solar cells and attempts to improve their efficiency and stability, and has been involved in renewable energy research and education for more than 25 years, leading a range of educational programs in renewable energy at the University.

2014-15 COUNCIL PERTH MODERNIAN SOCIETY

At the 2015 Year 12 Presentation Night in December 2015 Perth Modern School Head of Health and Physical Education Toni Jones presented **Adele Williams** with the Sports Citizen of the Year award. This award recognized Adele's outstanding contribution to coaching and mentoring younger students.

In 2015 Perth Modern School students won more WACE (Western Australian Certificate of Education) awards than any other secondary school with 79. **Hui Min Tay** was announced as the WACE Beazley Medallist for achieving the highest School Curriculum and Standards Authority award score, closely followed by Perth Modern School students **Hongyi Gao** and **Jet Kye Chong**.

Six (6) students achieved a perfect ATAR of 99.5, and nine students achieved a General Exhibition, which are awarded to 41 eligible students with the highest School Curriculum and Standards Authority award score based on the average of five scaled scores with at least two from each of the humanities/social science lists and the mathematics/science list. Five (5) students won a total of seven (7) Course Exhibitions. 43 Certificates of Distinctions were achieved and 75 students were awarded Certificates of Commendation. The cohort achieved a state average of 92.25 against a state average of 80.2. The School Curriculum and Standards Authority Awards Ceremony was held at Government house on Wednesday 17 February.

Principal of Perth Modern School Lois Joll said the Class of 2015 was a "wonderful group of young people who worked together with their families and teachers to achieve this exceptional result."

Among the 2015 WACE students who received awards were previously recipients of the **Dan Girling and John Down Music Scholarship**, and the **Dan Girling and John Down Music Bursary** awarded by the Sphinx Foundation (Inc) in 2013, and four (4) recipients of **Sphinx Foundation Centenary Entry Bursaries** awarded in 2011.

2015 SCHOLARSHIPS PRESENTED

Since commencement in 2009, a total of **26 Sphinx Scholarship Academic Awards** have been presented to Year 10 students enabling them to undertake various forms of academic extension in their Years 11 and 12 at Mod. 2015 was the first year the Scholarships in the **Sciences and Maths** have been awarded - this was made possible by the generosity of Don Tyler and several other Modernians.

Donation received

The Board of the Sphinx Foundation is very grateful indeed to the **Class of 1955** for making a Class Gift to the Sphinx Scholarship Fund. It is a tribute to the **60 Year Reunion** organising committee that it managed to run the 2015 reunion at a surplus, which I know is not easy to achieve. The money will be put towards the capital sum for the **Mathematics Scholarship** for a student completing Year 10 at Mod and tenable in their Years 11/12. The fund for this particular scholarship was kicked off in mid-2015 with contributions from several Modernians and it still needs more capital to be self-sustaining at the target amount of \$1000. The funds are held by the school and paid over progressively to the awardee upon production of receipts for resource materials and extension activities.

There are now **six (6) upper school academic excellence scholarships** of this type – in Music, Creative Writing, Physics, Chemistry, Biological Sciences/Psychology, and Mathematics, tenable years 11/12.

Re: Huntly Higgins, student 1930-34, Sphinx magazines

"My name is Barbara Higgins and I am the daughter of Huntly Higgins, a former student of Perth Modern School.

My parents died in the last 4 years and we sold their house. My father had some Sphinx magazines from the 1930's which I thought might be of interest to your archivist/librarian."

Ed: Response from the Historical and Museum Committee read: "Your email has been forwarded to me from the Sphinx Foundation. Huntly was a strong supporter of all endeavours of the PMS alumni organisations as they have evolved since he left as a student, and we were saddened to hear of his passing in 2011.

In an interview in 2000 he said of his schooling at PMS:

"I became a scientist and I don't think I was really inspired to study science at Modern School. I certainly developed a great love of scholarship – of knowledge - but I feel that Mod probably provided me with a better background in the arts than in the sciences. Perhaps I'm exaggerating that a bit but certainly it gave me a love of literature and even history to a certain extent although I didn't study that at very high level. Certainly in literature they gave me a very good grounding but I thought I was very fortunate in getting, such an education in Modern School. It was a very good basis for further education. Thank you sincerely for your offer to donate your father's Sphinx Magazines for our archives, which we would be privileged to accept."

From Barbara Higgins: "Thank you very much for your lovely email. I know that my father thought very highly of Perth Modern School, both educationally and emotionally. He kept in contact with friends that he made at that time until the end of his life. I have sent Huntly's *Sphinx* magazines. They include a *Sphinx* magazine from 1938 in which he is mentioned as an ex-student and also *The Old Modernian* from 1935 when he attended St. Georges College."

Ernest Oliver James OATS was born 11 June 1911 at Subiaco to Samuel Oats and Louisa Maud Oats nee Kyrwood. He had nine siblings, at least three of whom were born in Kalgoorlie in the preceding decade. The family lived in Barker Road Subiaco but by 1928 Samuel was in the Claremont Old Mens' Home, where he died the next year aged 65.

The West Australian on 18 November 1922 announced that he had won a Secondary School Scholarship, but school records showed he gained an Entrance Scholarship to Perth Modern School from 1924.He hoped to study Medicine but struggled with English throughout. He passed his Junior Certificate in French, Maths, Geography, Physics and Drawing, but needed English. The school recorded that his grandmother was ill in 1924 and an aunt died in 1926.

He left school on 31 October 1927 to work in McGibbon's office - James Sinclair McGibbon owned an accounting and auditing practice and was prominent in business and political circles.

Ernie started work at the Metropolitan Water Supply Department on 25 June 1928 as a temporary junior clerk and was appointed permanent in 1931. In 1932 he was married to Mollie and receiving Married Man's allowance. He rose steadily in the ranks and in 1940 was receiving what was called a Personality Allowance.

He joined the Citizens' Military Force in 1940 in the 7th Heavy Brigade, helping to man the coastal batteries at Fremantle and on Rottnest Island., as an acting Lieutenant. He enlisted in the army in 1942, was confirmed as Lieutenant, and spent the war in coastal batteries from the Torres Strait to Sydney. His war service records state that, in 1942, he had two dependants under the age of 16. If they were siblings, they must have been born shortly before his father's death or have been disabled in some way. I have found no record of children of his own.

After the war, Ernie resumed his career in the Metropolitan Water Supply, but apparently never studied. He reached a high clerical rank before the requirement for academic qualifications halted his advance. In his final years he was the department's Organisation and Methods Officer, achieving office efficiencies in the labour-intensive pre-computer days. Metropolitan Water Supply was practicing O & M while the Public Service Board still thought it was a Buddhist priest's chant.

Ernie retired at the age of 60 at about the time of his wife's death. He appeared to be living with an elder sister in Carlisle at the time of his death on 14 October 1984, aged 73.

The award winning HealthInfoNet stands as a tribute and lasting legacy to his determination and vision.

Neil was personally interested in and cared about his staff; he loved to hear their stories of travel, family and life. He had a wonderful sense of humour, including the ability to laugh at himself. He was enormously respected throughout the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health sector. He worked hard and long and it is such a great sadness that he did not get more time to enjoy his richly earned retirement with his family and friends. He will be sorely missed by his former colleagues and friends at *HealthInfoNet*, and we will continue to honour his life's work in all that we do.
