

### REUNIONS

The annual reunions for 2019/20 were held in September of each year respectively and were well attended despite Covid19. It is expected to have a good turn out next year too, as it should be the first reunion in the new auditorium. ### PERTH MODERN SCHOOL BOARD

As an Independent Public School (IPS), Perth Modern School has a school Board comprising the Principal, parents, staff and members of the general community. Since its inception the Society has been invited to nominate one of the Boards community members – a role filled in 2018/19/20 by Peter Farr. Modernian and former school patron Dr Ken Michael AC remained Chair of the Board during 2019/20.

### **MEMBERSHIP TRENDS**

The membership trends show a slightly upward trajectory from 2010 to 2018 (4,441 total members) but the latest figures are not available because of computer problems. Unfortunately, there is a regrettable and significant number of members passing away. Fortunately, we won the battle to keep the school open in 2017 and there is a renewing group of students coming through.

### STRATEGIC PLAN13

A modern Strategic plan to secure a sustainable future for the Society was launched at the Annual reunion on 13 September 2020. It is a comprehensive document in short form and has been developed into a brochure for convenient use. It shall shortly be placed on the Society's web site.

### SPHINX FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS

The Sphinx Foundation Inc. is an integral part of the Perth Modernian Society (Inc) run by a Board of five Directors, with representation also from the School's Vice Principal Val Furphy.

The Sphinx Scholarship Fund is a great success story. Most notably, the Sphinx Scholarship Fund reached \$1.2M at end of 2019. Thereby, from its earnings from investments, **41** new scholarships and bursaries, (plus **31** renewals from previous years) were awarded in Dec. 2019 to deserving students from Years 7 to 12, the value of which came to \$70,000. The total payout figure in the 10 years since the Fund's inaugural awards in 2009 is \$380,000.

The Sphinx Foundation Board was most pleased to be able to establish four new Sphinx scholarships in 2019:

- The Doss Family Scholarship
- > The John Christmass Choral Music Scholarship
- > The Jeanette McQueen Psychology Scholarship
- > The Perth Modernian Society Elite Physical Education Scholarship.

Courtesy of the splendid generosity of the **Malka Foundation**, funding was guaranteed to the Sphinx Board in late 2019 for at least the next three years to increase the dollar value of all entry level (Year 7) scholarships/ bursaries, together with the creation of two new needs-based scholarships (Year 8 and Year 10). Furthermore, the Malka Foundation will provide funding for at least the next three years to cover the delivery by the **Mannkal Economic Education Foundation** of Entrepreneurship and Leadership programs for selected PMS students. The benefits of this new partnership are expected to be very significant for PMS.

### MULTI-PURPOSE AUDITORIUM APPEAL

The Perth Modernian Society has enthusiastically supported the cause of obtaining a new auditorium and many Modernians, along with so many other members of the School community, contributed financially in 2019. The auditorium will be an asset for the wider community not just Perth Mod.

### THE FUTURE

The Perth Modernian Society is very pleased to be an integral part of the fabulous Perth Modern School Community. However, the many services provided by the Society, the Sphinx Foundation and the Perth Modernian Society Museum Association History Centre and Archives are only made possible by the dedication of many volunteers and donors; the challenge in 2020 and beyond is for lots of capable younger Modernians – staff and students – to join in this great work.

### Conclusion

I sincerely thank the Society's Councilors, the HM Committee and Volunteers, The Sphinx Foundation Board, many other volunteers and special contributors for the enormous amount of work and good will that they put in to so many projects during 2019.

### Introduction

As recorded below, the Foundation had another successful year despite the School, along with the whole of society having to adjust to operating in the COVID-19 pandemic. In late 2019 the Foundation succeeded in negotiating with the MALKA Foundation to receive \$20,000 per year for the next three years toward scholarships/bursaries for needy students, and to be the channel for \$15,000 to fund MANNKAL leadership and entrepreneurial programmes with students in the School. The Board was pleased that the 2020 Annual Appeal launched in May 2020 brought in almost \$25,000 even though the whole economy was entirely destabilised by the COVID-19 virus.

The Sphinx Scholarship Fund is independently audited by Anderson Munro & Wyllie. The Audit was completed in October 2019 with no adverse findings. (Audit Fee \$1500 + GST).

The Sphinx Foundation also submitted the 2019 Annual Information Statement by the 2019 AGM date, on time and as required, to the ACNC (Australian Charities and Notfor-profits Commission) as well as the Information Statement to the Consumer Protection arm of the Department of Commerce. BAS statements were submitted quarterly to the ATO.

### **Investment Sub-Committee**

As the Sphinx Scholarship Fund has grown to a considerable size, the investment market has become more complex, and other responsibilities have stretched the members of the Board, especially the Treasurer, an Investment-Subcommittee has been formed. Its overall function is to provide selection and management advice to the Treasurer and the Board on its portfolio of investments.

# REPORT FROM THE CHAIR OF THE BOARD Dr Robyn White HONOUR THE HISTORY, SHARE THE HERITAGE

This statement succinctly describes the essence of what we do – the Perth Modernian Society Museum Association Incorporated is responsible for overseeing the collection, preservation, conservation and displaying of elements of Perth Modern School's past and present. This activity takes place in the School Museum, where we are able to share the past and present with our alumni, their families and the wider community. Once again we are indebted to Sallie Davies – who first tagged this assertion as a coherent representation of the work of the Museum Committee and Museum Association Incorporated.

2019-20 has been an incredible year of energy and achievement for the Perth Modernian Society Museum Association Incorporated – despite the Covid related suspension of our efforts in April and May. We are a comparatively new entity, built on the collective volunteer efforts of a multitude of alumni since the PMS Historical and Museum Society commenced its work in 1973. These volunteers saw value in maintaining the archival records of the students and staff of Perth Modern School since 1911, collecting and conserving the School's art work and collecting, preserving and conserving student records and the many artefacts donated to the Perth Modernian Society. More recently the volunteers have worked on developing and extending the electronic data-base of past students and staff and in digitally accessioning, conserving and preserving artefacts. And why make these efforts? Because in time, these archives and artefacts provide a rich diversity of data available for families, researchers and the public to better understand the course of society, culture and education towards the present.

Following our previous year (2018-2019) of meeting the bureaucratic challenge of accreditation, the 2019- 2020 year has seen the Association focus on successful grant applications and fundraising so that the operation of the Museum and its activities might be extended.

2020 has seen our Board engage the services of a Heritage Consultant in order to facilitate the volunteer activities in the Museum - always with an eye to our future directions. Elaenor Nield commenced with us just prior to the COVID suspension. We have found several further opportunities to contract Elaenor's time in preparing grant applications as well as more recently, finding her IT skills particularly relevant. When you visit the Museum, please take the time to seek out Elaenor. As a graduate student in History, she is always interested in meeting alumni.

### **GRANT FUNDING FOR SPECIFIC PROJECTS**

Early in this financial year, the Association was focused on re-furbishing the World War I memorial and the World War II seat. Funding for this project was via a successful grant application to the Department of Veterans Affairs, Saluting Their Service for \$4,000, plus the very generous support from the family of alumni plus \$1000 donated by Bankwest. The results of this work will stand for many years – certainly worth a look on your next visit at the school.

A successful application to Lotterywest for \$8,250 contributed towards an upgrade to our communication software and server in 2019-20. This grant provided critical support to enhance our volunteer capacity to extend use of the digital data as well as further protect and conserve our heritage memorials and artefacts for the future.

As I write, the Museum Association Inc has three current grant applications submitted to various bodies:

- We have requested (through Bob Johnson) a further \$5016 from the Department of Veterans Affairs and \$1000 from the Museum Association, so that we might improve the accuracy of the Honour Boards in the Beasley Building with supplementary boards. This request also includes developing a digital Honour Board. The digital Honour Board will be placed on the school's website for use by students, staff, parents and the wider community
- A request for funding from the National Library Association for \$4,500 so that we might engage a professional evaluator to review our Museum collection and advise us on the most appropriate directions for the future
- We have also applied to the Western Australian History Foundation for \$9000 in funds to research and write a History of Music at Mod that will appropriately represent the path of Music education at the School and across public education, especially the Secondary Special Placement Program of 1968-2007.

### **FUND RAISING**

2020 marked the first time that the Museum Association has reached out to our wider community for extensive donations – albeit tax deductible donations now. We have been overwhelmed by the generosity of our community – especially in the context of Covid lockdown and the anxieties that came with the pandemic threat. At 30 June 2020, this first fundraiser had raised \$19595.00 – easily surpassing our modest expectations and certainly enabling our volunteers to consider some more comprehensive developments. From us all, a heartfelt thank you to all donors.

### VISITORS

Despite our required closure while the State directed the lockdown of Museums, we have enjoyed welcoming alumni and families to the Museum while we have been open. On the occasions that families were unable to attend while our volunteers were in attendance on Monday mornings, we have been very happy to open the museum at other times. Please ask if this would better suit you and your families.

Throughout Terms 1 and 2, the Museum was also opened for Mr Isaac Kigodi's Year 10 class where students learned about augmented reality programs and particularly used artefacts in the Museum as the basis for extending information and data. Their work was a revelation for volunteers and continues to suggest possibilities for future Museum exhibits. We look forward to continuing student presence in the Museum.

### THANK YOU

In closing, thank you to all members of the Board, who have freely given their time to make our meetings a valuable time to review our activities across the Museum – viewing both current efforts and planning for the future.

And then to our volunteers who are critical to the ongoing work of the Museum. Without their time, energy and patience, we would not be able to achieve what we do. That these people make this time an enjoyable exchange of ideas is even more appreciated. A wonderful group of people always looking for more to join us!!

# **MUSEUM [STANDING] COMMITTEE REPORT**

Previously the Historical and Museum Committee (H&MC) of the Perth Modernian Society

### Overview

Official notification of DGR status was received in January 2019. This Museum (History Centre/Museum summary embraces embraces volunteer activities in the History Centre and Archives from July 2019 through June 2020.

### 2020-22 Forward Plan

The 2020-22 Forward Plan for the Museum Association was developed and approved by the February 2020 meeting of the Museum Association and the Museum Standing Committee has worked in accordance with its requirements. This Committee schedules to meet on the first activity day of each School term to plan the work ahead within this framework and allow capacity to deal with unexpected enquiries and requests.

### **Preparation of Grant Applications**

The preparation of grant applications to the Dept of Veterans Affairs has been made possible through the dedication of the former Board Treasurer who stepped down from that role in order to volunteer his time to this project. Congratulations to Bob Johnson for his Moderna Scola Award in recognition of this work.

Other grant applications have been prepared by Heritage Consultant Elaenor Nield whose engagement was approved by the Board to support the Volunteer Standing Committee early in the School year.

### Impact of Covid-19

The Museum Association Board determined that the Museum activities would operate in accordance with State and Federal Government requirements from Monday 6 April due to the Covid-19 emergency. The meeting of the Museum Committee was deferred from the scheduled date Monday 4 May, the first day of the new school term, until 8 June. Volunteers continued to meet student and staff requirements throughout and through on line communication and the class project was completed. We have yet to see a demonstration of the final result.

## **Councillors' Profiles**

The Council comprised these eleven members in 2019:

Barrie Baker BA(Hons), Dip Ed, Dip Comp, Dip Theol, Dip Ed Admin Vice President, Functions Coordinator and Finance Committee Chair Barrie was a PMS student 1954-1958, and after graduating at UWA, like many PMS students from the scholarship era, he followed a teaching vocation starting 1964 at Mount Lawley Senior High School. Barrie spent his whole working career in the field of education, the last 33 years of which were in Technical Education. He was a pioneer in computer education in Western Australia, both TAFE and for three years at the WA Treasury in charge of State Government



computer training. He held positions in TAFE ranging from lecturer to Assistant Director. Whilst there he was seconded part time to the Public Service Commission Doig Management Centre to set up computer training there. He was also in charge of the development of the East Perth TAFE campus.

Barrie has an interest in urban heritage and won the 2011 WA Heritage Council Award for the individual making the greatest contribution to heritage in Western Australia. He is patron of the Mount Lawley Society and a volunteer music teacher at his local primary school. Barrie has other extensive community involvements including the Australian Student Christian Movement and is a Lay Pastoral Minister in the Anglican Church. He is active in the Australian Shareholders' Association and was convener of its North of the River group for 14 years until 2015.

Barrie has served on the Council of the Perth Modernian Society (Inc) since its formation in 1995. He served as president for seven years (2006 to 2013), and he became a Vice President in 2017. He has been the Functions Coordinator since 1996 and Convenor of the Finance and Fundraising Committee since 2011

Barrie has been a Director of the board of the Sphinx Foundation since 2000, serving also as secretary and chairman. His interests in these positions have been steering the Foundation to more effectively serve the educational needs of PMS students, especially in providing scholarship incentives for worthy students. He was elected its Chairman in 2017.

At the 2016 Annual Reunion, Barrie was named as a Modernian Fellow for his distinguished contribution to the Perth Modernian Society and thereby the advancement of education at Perth Modern School.

# Ruth Barrett BA (née McWhinney), BA, Dip Ed, Grad Dip Ed (Reading Education) Vice President

Ruth attended Perth Modern School from 1952 to 1956, being one of five Mod Bods from the McWhinney family. She studied at UWA and Claremont Teachers College, and went on to teach Junior Primary classes at what was then South Terrace Primary School (now re-named Fremantle Primary). Among the 54 children in her first class, there was only one that spoke English. In 1964 she undertook a pilot program for the Education Department, teaching English to older children: they figured the younger ones would quickly pick up the language by themselves. Ruth completed a BA, majoring in English, later a Diploma of Education, and Graduate Diploma (Reading Education).



In 1965, with husband George (who had an exchange teaching position) Ruth went to England, and taught there for most of that year. On their return they started a family.

In 1970 Ruth was asked to lecture in English Literature at Claremont Teachers College, just for a term. George and Ruth had a long holiday in Europe in 1971, and came back to WA to continue their family. In 1975 she was asked to fill in again at CTC, this time in Junior Primary Method. That was followed by a semester in the Music Department. After that she began to lecture in the Graduate Diploma in Reading Education at CTC, Claremont. Over the next few years Ruth lectured in Language Education at the Graylands and Mount Lawley Campuses as they were amalgamated into WACAE then Edith Cowan University respectively. She lectured at the Churchlands Campus until around 1996, and continued to supervise students on teaching practice until 2000.

Ruth has had a long connection with the Claremont Museum, and for many years has been a Friend of the WA Museum. She is also a member of the Royal Western Australian Historical Society. When she gets time, she pursues family history – including the family's ANZAC links to Gallipoli.

# Deborah Beresford B App Sci (Library Studies) WAIT Hon Secretary

Deborah graduated as a teacher from Graylands Teachers College in 1962 and then taught at Metropolitan primary schools before marriage. In 1974, she was appointed to Perth Modern School as a Teacher Librarian where she taught until her retirement in 2007.

In 1995 she joined the Perth Modernian Society (Inc.) and has been on the Council since 2006 and has served as the Secretary since 2008. In 2009, she joined the Historical and Museum Committee taking on the role of Honorary Archivist for the Perth Modernian Society, an appointment she still holds. Sallie was a student at Perth Modern School from 1951-1955. A Home Science Teacher in the country before transferring to Perth Modern School in 1961,

married in 1962 and moved back to the country where she was involved in various community activities. Back in Perth in 1972 she became involved in P&C Associations and with Stirling Players and the development of Stirling Theatre.

In 1978 she was appointed Coordinator of the 150th Celebrations for the City of Stirling and was subsequently invited by the Stirling City Council to establish a community support service. In 1990, she was awarded the Rotary Club of Osborne Park City of Stirling Merit Award for Community and Vocational Service. She was elected Chairperson of the Volunteer Centre of Western Australia, and subsequently became its Executive Director, retiring as Executive Director of Volunteering Western Australia in 2001. A founding Director on the Board of Volunteering Australia Sallie served on national committees from 1990 and was awarded a Centenary Medal for her services to the community through Volunteering Western Australia.

Sallie joined the Board of the Sphinx Foundation and coordinated the Publication Working party responsible for researching and publishing '*Perth Modern School: The History and the Heritage*'. She became chair the Historical and Museum Committee and represented that Committee on the Society Council from 2007. As Newsletter Coordinator she is part of the Communications working group and has been involved in the development of the portal, JeD (Jarvis ex-Mod Database), the integrated former staff/student database, the e-Newsletters and the Magazine for Contributing Members. She has been integrally involved with the development and coordination of the History Centre since 2009.

As Chair of the Historical and Museum Committee she was invited to be a member of the P&C Committee supporting the School Centenary publication *"Past Present and Future of Perth Modern School"*. Sallie also supported volunteers Alison Woodman and Roger Stubbs who prepared the more recent School publication *"A Celebration of Contribution"* published in 2016.

In 2014 Sallie was named as one of the three inaugural *Modernian Fellows* for her distinguished contribution to the Perth Modernian Society and thereby the advancement of education at Perth Modern School. In early 2018 Sallie became a founding member of the Board of the new Perth Modernian Society Museum Association Incorporated and elected as its inaugural Chair.

# Peter Farr BE(Hons), BEc, MASc, C.Eng, FAICD, FAIM Immediate Past President

Peter was a Perth Modern School scholarship student 1954-1958. After graduating in Canada in 1966 with a Masters degree, Peter has followed careers totalling over 50 years in engineering and management consulting. He has board experience with private companies, and as a Fellow of both the Australian Institute of Company Directors and the Australian Institute of Management, he has a strong background in Corporate Governance best practice. He has had community involvement with appointments on the Council and Treasurer of St Catherine's College

(UWA), Convocation (University of Western Australia), Parents and Citizens Committees, the Royal Freshwater Bay Yacht Club Offshore Committee, St John of God Subiaco Hospital Consumer Advisory Group and Policy Sub-Committee.

Peter has made a large commitment to the Perth Modernian Society (Inc) having been a Councillor for over ten years and he has served as its Vice President or President since 2006. New initiatives he has played a role in are the Portal, corporate Style Manual, the Sphinx Scholarship Fund, the Annual Oration, Perth Modernian Society Awards scheme, the Society's inaugural Strategic Plan, Annual Report in 'best practice' format, Constitutions revision, and Governance standards. He has also been Treasurer and on the organising committee for all the 1954-58 class reunions.

He was appointed as a Director of the Sphinx Foundation Inc. in 2008 and as Hon. Treasurer in 2009. He has been involved with the Sphinx Scholarship Fund as its Treasurer and investment manager since its inception in 2009 during which time the fund has grown to over \$900,000. # Julian Grill LLB, JP Elected Member

Julian attended Perth Modern School in 1956 and 1957 and was part of the victorious Australia Rules side in each year. Ed attended Perth Modern School from 1956 to 1960 and was selected as a prefect. He continued to UWA to study Electrical Engineering with a cadetship from the Stat Electricity Commission.

He graduated with Honours in 1965, and left WA to pursue a career in electronics. He spent 4 years at AWA involved in electronic design before joining IBM in 1969. Ed's IBM career spanned 27 years and his roles in the Systems Engineering area included installing software systems in many industries in

Australia and Asia. He spent 2 years in an IBM research and Development Centre in Florida, responsible for teaching new software to IBM and customer personnel throughout many countries. He represented IBM on Standards, and Industry Telecommunications related Committees.
